SOUTHERN CAPE JUNIOR GOLF REPORT – 2014

In addition to the 12 Order of Merit tournaments that are held by Southern Cape Junior golf an additional 5 “Kenako series” tournaments and a further 2 Sanlam Glacier Junior Series events within the Southern Cape (Fancourt and Mossel Bay) results in a total of 19 possible tournaments for juniors to enter, outside of National order of Merit events and Open events within the Southern Cape. What has been encouraging this year is that the number of juniors that play in the Southern Cape men’s Order of Merits events has increased.

The abovementioned events exclude those of the high schools and primary golf schools league. We have found that the high schools league players all participate at the Southern Cape Junior Order of Merit events. Whereas with the primary school’s leagues we have found that it is well supported until the qualifying rounds for the Ernie Els Primary Schools’ championship has been played.

Our aim is to provide a platform for juniors to compete at junior tournaments and grow the game by way of introduction of golf to juniors through the primary schools program and high schools program. The latter’s players generally participate at our events. Without detracting from all of the efforts from those within the golfing fraternity, it is our opinion that the primary schools arena is an area which needs to be targeted (i.e. solicit interest in golf at a young age). The High Schools league makes provision for the qualification for high schools to qualify and participate at the annual Retief Goosen High Schools Championship. In the same fashion the Primary Schools League makes provision for the qualification for primary schools to qualify and participate at the annual Ernie Els Primary Schools Championship. What we have noticed though at primary schools level is that the competition from and conflict with other sporting codes from a diary perspective has been great and we therefore plan to incorporate the various divisions thereof into our SCGU junior tournaments from a primary schools A & B division perspective instead of attempting to host these tournaments separately. The primary schools A division will be easily incorporated into our junior tournaments as most of these players already play at our events, however we would like to create an environment where the B division juniors will be able to experience a tournament as well as the aspirational elements of being introduced to the environment where Provincial juniors are present. It is hoped that in this fashion we can foster a long term relationship with the juniors and get them hooked on golf. They are after all the potential future members of all of the golf clubs within the Southern Cape. The Southern Cape Golf Academy, which is run by Roelof Roeloffze, will continue to facilitate the primary schools tournaments from the B division perspective. This division does however only play 9 holes and it is therefore requested that where possible we facilitate them at the back of our “normal” field. It is traditionally, better for us to have a two tee start, for our “normal” field to avoid long waiting periods before prize giving.

We are extremely grateful to Nomads who have kindly donated i-pads to Southern Cape Junior Golf for the purposes of live scoring at our events. The Albatross system allows us to ensure that players’ scores are captured for handicap purposes accurately as well as assisting us in providing an opportunity to parents to rather let their children pay golf on their own whilst still being able to monitor how the tournaments unfolds. It has also served us well from a speedy results perspective at the tournaments. It has been very well received.

In addition we are further grateful to Nomads and Auto Imperial and MFC for agreeing to contribute R75,000 per annum for the next 3 years to the Heptangular event that is taking place in October. It was much needed as it was an event that some Unions were about to withdraw from. A much needed life line has been provided for the tournament from a cost perspective and we are looking forward to a successful event from 5 – 8 October.

In closing we would like to extend our gratitude to all junior golf coaches, SAGDB, the junior golf academies and importantly the golf clubs in the Southern Cape who support the juniors – the future members of the clubs.

From a results perspective the winners of the Southern Cape Junior Order of Merit and Kenako series tournaments is supplied below for completeness as well as results of team events and national tournaments . In addition our individual

prizes for the year are noted in addition to the competition winners. Lastly a graphical representation of the tournaments is indicated at the end of the document.


